

Ponder over this:

 2013 WHO "Global Status Report on Road Safety" indicates RSA's quality of law enforcement rates amongst the worst in the world – 2.6 out of 10, compared with world average of 6.0 and a high of 8.6 (France).

Compare with:

(Swaziland = 5.8; Zimbabwe = 5.0 and Namibia = 4.4).

- Effective public awareness, communication & education programmes;
- Transparent & expeditious adjudication processes;
- Points demerit system;
- Rehabilitation programmes




